To all Involved Agencies:

The Village of Chester Planning Board has had placed before it an application for Amended Site Plan and Special Permit approval of the Castle Fun Center Site Plan project, located off NYS Route 17M within the Village. The application before the Village Planning Board involves, in general, a proposed 5000 square foot addition to the recreation center building, an elevated Zip Line (extending into the Town of Chester), and other related site modifications. It is the opinion of the Village of Chester Planning Board that the action is an Unlisted Action under SEQRA. This letter is written as a request for Lead Agency Coordination as required under Part 617 of the Environmental Conservation Law. The Village Planning Board seeks a coordinated review of the identified site changes, primarily due to the fact that the Zip Line activity crosses the municipal boundary. The Village is aware that other activities are proposed on the Town portion of the site; however, the Town has initiated a uncoordinated review for these items, and those activities will not be the subject of the Village's SEQRA review.

A letter of response with regard to your interest in the position of Lead Agency, as defined by Part 617, Title 6 of the Environmental Conservation Law and the SEQRA review process, sent to the Planning Board at the above address, attention of Richard Ramsdell, Planning Board Chairman, would be most appreciated. Should no other involved agency desire the Lead Agency position; it is the desire of the Village of Chester Planning Board to assume such role. Should the Planning Board fail to receive a written response requesting Lead Agency within thirty (30) days, it will be understood that you do not have an interest in the Lead Agency position. 
